Tuesday: After struggling with seizures Jeffrey had a chilled day whilst they did their own thing before heading home. In the night Jeffrey dislodged his NG tube which frightened the life out of me. After whipping the tube out he was absolutely fine but I was up until 3am watching him sleep.

Wednesday: This morning was relaxed, we started off with a walk to put the recycling and rubbish in the designated area before going for lunch to find the restaurant closed for the day due to the Bank Holiday. On the way it started pouring so we waited the rain out before going back to the lodge for the afternoon. Jeffrey's dad Andy drove to see us after work for tea. We found a lovely place to eat. When we walked in the landlady was amazing, taking us to a table with three menus laid out as she wanted Jeffrey to be included. Jeffrey loves soup and she made sure it was cooled to room temperature so as soon as it came out he could get stuck in. As we were finishing up she came over, knelt down and told us that our bill had been settled by one of her lovely locals who thought we deserved a treat! We couldn't believe it and safe to say I got teary, as did she. Such a lovely and kind

gesture. After we got back to the lodge Andy tucked Jeffrey into bed, had a brew, and was on his way as he was working in the morning.

Thursday: We were very lucky to get a visit from two of our favourite people - Jeffrey's God mum and her beautiful daughter! The weather had picked up and we enjoyed a walk around the lake, a visit to the mini beach and fed the ducks before getting some lunch.
